

Surfaces

- To clean the table surfaces, use a damp cloth or sponge and a mild soap or detergent.
- Use a soft, non-abrasive cloth and lightly dampen it in the diluted cleaning solution.
- DO NOT USE abrasive cleaners or cloths. This will cause scratching.
- Use a fresh dry cloth to absorb all remaining moisture off of the surface. Any remaining moisture can leave discoloration and marks.

Metal Table Bases

- To clean the table bases, use a damp cloth or sponge and a mild soap or detergent.
- Use a soft, non-abrasive cloth and lightly dampen it in the diluted cleaning solution.
- DO NOT USE abrasive cleaners or cloths. This will cause scratching.
- DO NOT soak the base in water. This will cause rusting.
- Use a fresh dry cloth to absorb all remaining moisture off of the surface of the table base.

Handling and Moving Tables
